In the summer, The Patachou Foundation will launch the Food Fellowship, a paid 6-week summer intensive work development program for high schoolers centered around the food system. Students will learn transferable skills in farming, cooking, hospitality and customer service, as well as soft-skills and communication techniques.

Together, we all make sure our neighbors don’t go to bed hungry today, and we are working towards providing real economic opportunity through food to keep them from hunger and poverty for the rest of their lives.

Kitchen HQ, The Patachou Foundation’s new home base, opened in September 2019 after a capital campaign that saw the community rally behind the vision of a transformative hub for culinary and community collaboration.

The building houses a commercial kitchen to prepare the more than 2,000 high-quality meals it serves at eight Indianapolis schools each week.

The foundation had outgrown its current kitchen space shared with Patachou Inc. restaurant group, owned by the foundation’s founder Martha Hoover. “Since its inception, The Patachou Foundation has been an example of new philanthropic normative values,” said Hoover.

The production kitchen will also convert into a teaching kitchen for student lessons from industry professionals.

A public, for-profit coffee shop operated by the foundation opened in the Fall, which will generate a revenue stream to help support the project. The foundation will offer job skills training to the youth it serves through the coffee shop’s operations.

“This unique food fellowship will introduce young people to how a business is run, and how our food system works – from farming and food preparation to point of sale and customer service,” says Executive Director Matthew Feltrop.

Feltrop adds, “At Kitchen HQ, The Patachou Foundation increases its capacity to fight hunger - both by serving more wholesome meals at our partner meal sites and by teaching skills and healthy habits that benefit youth their whole lives.”



Our 6th Annual Speakers Forum presented by Taft focused on shifting the narrative about gun violence from the lens of the criminal justice system to treating violence as a public health crisis.

Our featured speaker, Marcus McAllister of Cure Violence Global, shared his personal experience as a formerly incarcerated individual, his work as a violence interrupter, and how it is imperative to include those with criminal backgrounds in the conversation on solutions to violence.

McAllister was later joined on stage by panelists Shonna Majors, the City of Indianapolis's first-ever director of community violence reduction, and Lisa E. Harris, M.D. of Eskenazi Health.

The conversation was moderated by Jordyn Lexton, CEO of Drive Change and 2016 Speakers Forum featured speaker.



The 2019 Speakers Forum raised over \$80,000 for The Patachou Foundation to continue meeting the needs of young Indianapolis neighbors.
